Dear Friends,

Have you ever spent time searching for something, only to discover you had it with you the entire time? That happened to me with my cell phone once. I looked all over the house for it, and finally called it from my husband's phone only to feel it vibrating in my pants pocket! The same thing can happen with our faith sometimes. Maybe we feel that God isn't with us, or that we're searching for God's presence in our lives and we just can't seem to find it. Perhaps we're filled with fear or doubt; overwhelmed by anxiety. We forget the words of Jesus, from the Gospel of John:

"I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. This is the Spirit of truth...I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you." (John 14:16-17a, 18a)

God sends us the Holy Spirit to be a very real presence with us every day. But often we forget that the Spirit of truth is always with us, tucked safely against our side, like a cell phone in our pocket. Through the Holy Spirit we communicate with God and God speaks to us. Maybe God is even trying to call us right now, but we've set the phone to silent.

In chapter 17 of the book of Exodus the Israelites have lost sight of God. They're wandering in the desert and they're thirsty and they're afraid. They've already forgotten God's promise of faithfulness. Chapter 15 recounts the miracle of the parting of the sea and their escape from the armies of Pharaoh. Chapter 16 describes how God provided manna for them in the wilderness. Yet here they are in Chapter 17 complaining once again, *"Why did you bring us out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and livestock with thirst?"* In their anguish they've forgotten how God has always been there for them in the past, protecting and providing for them.

Moses is fed up with the Israelites, but God has compassion for them. God commands Moses to strike a rock with his staff and from the desert God brings refreshing water. God hasn't forgotten them in their time of need. Even when we behave like the Israelites, forgetting God in our moments of selfishness or despair, God is steadfast and faithful, never forgetting us.

When we understand that God is faithful in all circumstance, we can begin to grow in our own faithfulness. Faithfulness is being reliable and true to one's promise. God's faithfulness never ends, but what about our own? Are we faithful friends, caring and supporting each other? Are we faithful colleagues, encouraging and lifting each other up? Are we faithful followers, trusting in God and sharing God's love with the world? As we move into this season of thankfulness I pray that we will all have an attitude of gratitude, especially for God's eternal mercy and grace.

#### NEWS FROM THE OUTREACH TEAM

The Outreach Team is continuing to develop new community partners. On September 27, 2022, the team hosted **Family Promise of the Poconos** at one of our (BYO) Coffee Talks. We engaged Enid Logan, Executive Director, and two of the agency's Pike County caseworkers in a wide ranging conversation about homelessness in Pike County. In addition, Ms. Logan shared information about the family shelter that Family Promise is opening, within the next few months, right in our neighborhood. How can Milford United Methodist Church, as their 'local church' support them in their work? How can we be an effective neighbor? An immediate way in which we are able to be a good neighbor is to provide space for caseworkers to meet with families in a secure, private setting (rather than in the back of the library). Many thanks to the Trustees for ALWAYS seeing the church building as a resource for mission.
