# A LETTER FROM PASTOR JENN

Dear Friends.

When I was growing up I loved getting new clothes at the start of the school year. We didn't have a lot of money, but somehow my parents always managed to afford some new outfits and it helped me get excited about going back to school. We'd shop at the end of August and I'd look forward to the first day when I could wear my new cargo pants or suede leather skirts, cowl neck sweaters and Robin Hood boots. Inevitably, the first week of September would bring a hot spell and all of my new fall clothing would have to wait until, well, fall!

We all know how difficult going to school can be for our children and youth. For me, a fashionable outfit felt like armor, protecting me from the bullies who made fun of my curly hair. As Christians, we have armor that protects us as well. In Ephesians 6:11 we are encouraged to "put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil". The armor of God is not an actual physical outfit, but rather spiritual strength and protection needed for us to stand firm in our faith. Our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the spiritual forces of evil.

"Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on the evil day and, having prevailed against everything, to stand firm. Stand, therefore, and belt your waist with **truth** and put on the breastplate of **righteousness** and lace up your sandals in preparation for the gospel of peace. With all of these, take the shield of **faith**, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of **salvation** and the sword of the Spirit, which is the **word of God**."

As Christians we stand in the truth of the Spirit, developing a right relationship with God. Our faith is born of salvation, and strengthened by the word of God as revealed in scripture and made visible in the Living Christ. We know that there will be struggles in life. There will be bullies, and worse. There will be grief and suffering. There will be challenges that shake the very foundations of our faith. But through it all, we are clothed in the glory of the resurrected Jesus; a new outfit that helps us face each day with strength and hope and courage.

The armor of God doesn't always come easily or fit comfortably. Sometimes it feels too warm as if it's the wrong season; too tight, or too loose. We have to work at it, polishing the metal, softening the leather. We do this through spiritual disciplines. We pray and worship. We join in fellowship with other Christians. We study the Bible and we serve in missions. We practice our faith in order to grow in faith, and the more we get to know God, the stronger our armor becomes.

It is always a new season in our faith; always a day of new beginnings. I pray you have joy and excitement as you clothe yourself in Christ and face the future unafraid.

The first meeting of the MUMC Green Team (A.K.A. Caretakers of Creation, Stewards) was held on Sunday, August 18th. We had a great group of people show up, and the conversation brought about some great ideas for helping our church & our community be better stewards of God's creation. One idea we discussed is the need for more accessible recycling bins in our building. Mr. Richard had the great idea of upcycling cardboard boxes to use as recycling bins instead of buying new ones! So if you see a lovely cardboard box with the recycling logo on it, please put your recyclables in it! All bins in the church go to a single-stream recycling service, so you can put any recyclable item in whatever bin strikes your fancy! If you are thinking to yourself, "Is this recyclable?" you are not alone! At the bottom of this article you will find a list of common items that can or cannot be recycled. Navigating recycling can be a little tricky at first, but recycling keeps waste out of landfills and helps to conserve our natural resources, helping us to live in harmony with Creation.

Another idea we discussed was promoting the mug rack that Mr. Roger Hughes had built for us. The mug rack is located in the Fellowship Hall and is a great way for us to avoid using disposable cups and choose a reusable option. Bring your own mug or use one of the many on the rack.
