Dear Friends,

I was in my late 20s when I first began exploring the possibility of becoming a minister. I met with my Pastor who suggested I keep a journal of theological reflections. It was important, she explained, that I learned to "think theologically". I had no idea what she meant! Did ministers think differently than other people, I wondered; and what did she mean by "theology"?

The word "theology" intimidated me. It wasn't until I learned that it's made up of two Greek words – "theos" meaning "God", and "logos" meaning "word" – that I came to understand its simple meaning. Theology is God talk. I wasn't intimidated anymore because I talked about God, and talked with God, all the time! Theological reflection is intentionally exploring our relationship with the world in conversation with God. When I watch a bird take flight I marvel at the physics, and I compliment the designer. It's as if I'm in a constant conversation with God, admiring all that God has created, and seeking to know God better through genuine dialogue.

Over the years I've grown in my ability to think theologically. The more I practiced, the more instinctive it became. And I quickly learned that ministers don't think differently than others. Anyone who is seeking a deeper relationship with God and is intentional in their prayer life, is thinking theologically. As we ask the big questions of life, search the scriptures for wisdom, and pray to God for understanding, we are learning God talk.

The writers of the Psalms were always engaged in theological reflection. They looked at the world around them and saw God's fingerprints in all of creation. They experienced suffering and wrote about their struggles, processing their pain and remembering God's goodness. They had genuine dialogue with the Divine. They listened for God's wisdom and found comfort and joy in God's abiding presence. May we all do the same!

I bless the Lord, who gives me counsel; in the night also my heart instructs me. I keep the Lord always before me; because he is at my right hand, I shall not be moved. Therefore my heart is glad, and my soul rejoices; my body also rests secure. You show me the path of life. In your presence there is fullness of joy; in your right hand are pleasures forevermore. (Psalm 16:7-9, 11)


The Crafty Ladies are looking for donations of used light bulbs. If you have any of these items to share, please drop them off in the church office.

June Book Study: Jesus & John Wayne

Get ready for an exciting lay-led book study coming your way in June. The name of the book is *Jesus and John Wayne: How White Evangelicals Corrupted a Faith and Fractured a Nation* by Kristin Kobes Du Mez, PhD. The author, a professor of history and gender studies at Calvin University, a private Christian university in Grand Rapids, Michigan, looks at the last 75 years of white evangelicalism, showing how some American evangelicals have worked for decades to replace the Jesus of the gospels with an idol of rugged masculinity



and Christian nationalism. The book is available through Amazon. Saddle up your horses and join us in person or by Zoom for four weekly sessions starting June 7th and continuing the 14th, 21st, and 28th.

In preparation for the book study, we will be showing two brief videos on May 21st and May 28th during fellowship time.
