Dear Friends,

As we begin 2024 I'm reminded of the Brian Wren hymn, "This Is a Day of New Beginnings." Verse 1 reads:

This is a day of new beginnings, time to remember and move on, Time to believe what love is bringing, laying to rest the pain that's gone.

I believe this is good advice for all of us, as we welcome in the new year. We look back at 2023 and we remember all that we've experienced. For some it was a time of personal loss, for others a year of health challenges. Some welcomed new faces while others said good-bye to old friends. Still others experienced deep joy and personal success. For all of us it is a year that has fled away, the good and the bad, and we are left wondering what the future holds.




